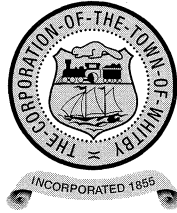

**Re: Circulation of Notice on the Oshawa Municipal Airport Expansion**

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The purpose of this letter is to gain further clarification on the rationale regarding why the circulation of the Oshawa Municipal Airport expansion notice did not cross the Whitby municipal boundary.

After reviewing the Development Services Report (DS-11-392) on the proposed expansion and relocations from Buttonville and Pearson Airports, this expansion may adversely affect Whitby residents in close proximity to the Oshawa Municipal Airport.


The report reads,

"Notice of this meeting of the Development Services Committee was given: by phone calls or emails to all persons who attended the June 23, 2011 public meeting; by an advertisement in the Oshawa This Week and the Oshawa Express newspapers; **by the delivery of notices by Canada Post to all homes in the area bounded by the Whitby border, Rossland Road, Simcoe Street North and Conlin Road;** and by letters from the Airport Manager to everyone who has filed a noise concern. The City recently learned that Canada Post delivered the notices around December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011."

We ask that any future public notice include lands in Whitby based on Transport Canada's registered zoning by-law. The approved 2005 Noise Exposure Forecast Contours are found in the Consultant's report under Section 7.3. This figure shows a portion of Whitby which is currently affected by the airports noise.
